

Toddler Montessori Classroom

Dear Families,

This month in our Montessori classroom, we explored two exciting themes: ****Transportation**** and ****Roll/Not Roll****. These topics provided rich opportunities for hands-on learning and discovery, sparking the children's curiosity and engagement.

Themes of the Month

****Transportation****

The children learned about different modes of transportation, exploring vehicles that move through air, land, and water. They classified these modes, explored images, and participated in a variety of activities that deepened their understanding. The children were especially excited to name and match different vehicles to their respective environments, fostering both language and cognitive development.

****Roll/Not Roll****

In this theme, the children classified objects based on whether they roll or not. They painted using rolling objects, which allowed them to combine creative expression with scientific observation. We also explored objects in our environment to determine which belong to the "Roll" category and which to "Not Roll." These activities encouraged critical thinking and hands-on experimentation.

A Significant Step in Independence

We are thrilled to share the progress the children have made in their independence. They are mastering everyday tasks such as putting on their coats and tidying their workspaces. This growth reflects their increasing confidence and ability to take responsibility for themselves, key principles of the Montessori philosophy.

Pre Primary and Kindergarten Montessori

Dear Parents and Families,

Happy New Year! We are excited to share all the wonderful learning and growth that took place in January in our Montessori classroom. Here's a look at the activities we explored:

Practical Life

In January, our friends worked on a variety of practical life skills that helped them build independence and coordination. Some highlights include:

- **Matching Mittens** – A fun, seasonal activity that helped the children strengthen their matching skills.
- **Soap Grinding** – This activity was a great way for the friends to practice fine motor skills while learning how soap is made.
- **Liquid Transfer (1 to 3)** – Using small pitchers and containers, children worked on transferring liquids, refining their hand-eye coordination.
- **Funnel Transfers** – With different sizes of funnels, children practiced transferring small objects, deepening their understanding of volume and size.
- **Food Tasting** – A sensory activity where our children explored new flavors and textures, expanding their taste awareness.

Math Curriculum

In Math this month, our friends engaged in a variety of hands-on activities:

- **Fraction Cones with Bases** – Our friends learned basic fraction concepts by using cones with color-coded bases to represent parts of a whole.
- **Numerals Matching (1 to 20)** – Our children practiced matching numerals with the correct quantity, reinforcing number recognition.
- **Addition Strip Board** – For our friends who are already working on advanced Math curriculum, the addition strip board helped reinforce additional concepts with visual aids and interactive play.

Sensorial

This month, we continued exploring the World of sensorial materials to enhance our friends perception of their environment:

- **Geometric Solids Review (and extensions with Geometric cabinet)** – Our friends worked with various geometric solids, shapes and extensions exploring with bases, refining their spatial awareness.

Language

Language development was in full swing this month:

- **Sight Words Matching Activities** – The friends used flashcards to reinforce sight word recognition, improving their reading skills.
- **Sentence Formation** – For our kindergarteners, we focused on helping them form complete sentences, enhancing their written expression.
- **Metal Insets Booklets** – Friends worked on their precision and control with these metal insets, helping them to practice drawing shapes and developing fine motor skills.
- **Letter Formation on Easels** – Through the use of easels, friends practiced forming letters with greater attention to detail and accuracy.

Geography

In Geography, friends traveled around the world to discover new continents and animals:

- **Asia** – Our friends learned about the continent of Asia, exploring its famous animals through hands-on activities such as creating their own animal booklets.
- **Pushpin Maps** – Friends used pushpins to trace the continent's shape and learn about Geographical features.
- **Antarctica Animals Coloring Activity** – We wrapped up our Geography exploration with a creative coloring activity featuring animals from Antarctica.

We are so proud of all the progress our friends have made this month. Their curiosity, enthusiasm, and dedication to learning continue to inspire us every day. We look forward to the exciting adventures and learning opportunities February will bring!

Enrichment programs

Hello Everyone!

In this exciting January edition, we have elaborated on different International Language and Science sessions:

Hindi:

We are excited to share the progress we've made in our Hindi learning journey this month! January has been a month of review, reinforcement, and expanding our knowledge. Here's a recap of what we've covered:

1. Reviewing Previous Work: This month, we dedicated time to revisiting and strengthening the foundational work we learned earlier. We went over key concepts and vocabulary to ensure that

everyone feels confident and comfortable with their previous lessons. This review helped refresh our memory and solidified our learning.

2. Numbers in Hindi - Extending the Knowledge: Building on what we learned last month, we took our understanding of numbers to the next level. This time, we focused on sorting objects according to their quantities, using Hindi numbers to describe and classify them. This activity was designed in a Montessori-inspired way, making it engaging and interactive. Sorting objects not only helped reinforce number recognition but also encouraged critical thinking and spatial awareness.

3. Hindi Letters – Mastery in the Making: Our journey with the Hindi alphabet continued with a focus on letter recognition and pronunciation. We practiced writing and reading Hindi letters, paying special attention to their shapes, sounds, and correct usage. This was an important step in helping students feel confident while reading and writing in Hindi.

4. Fruits in Hindi – Learning through Vocabulary: This month, we explored the names of various fruits in Hindi. The children learned to identify and pronounce the names of common fruits like:

- सेब (Seb) – Apple
- केला (Kela) – Banana
- संतरा (Santra) – Orange
- अंगूर (Angoor) – Grapes
- अमरूद (Amrood) – Guava
- तरबूज (Tarbooj) – Watermelon

Each fruit was also associated with a fun activity, helping to reinforce the vocabulary and make the learning experience memorable.

Looking Ahead: As we move into February, we will continue to build on these concepts, introducing new topics while reviewing the previous ones to ensure strong retention. We will also focus on incorporating more practical conversations and exercises in Hindi to enhance language proficiency.

Spanish:

This month in Spanish class, we explored two engaging topics: **Transportation** and **Numbers**. Through interactive activities and hands-on learning, they continued to build their Spanish vocabulary and develop foundational skills.

Transportation

The children learned the Spanish names for various modes of transportation, including:

- Motocicleta (Motorcycle)
- Bicicleta (Bicycle)
- Barco (Boat)
- Carro (Car)
- Avión (Airplane)
- Tren (Train)

Through songs and visual aids, they practiced recognizing and using these words.

Numbers

The focus on numbers included recognizing numbers in written form, associating them with objects, and oral counting.

- **Toddler Class**: The children worked on numbers 1 through 5, practicing with objects, counting and matching activities.
- **Pre-primary Class**: The children focused on numbers 1 through 10 and began exploring higher numbers through oral counting activities.

One of the most exciting activities involved counting the children present each day, helping them practice numbers in a real-world context while fostering group participation.

Science based Art session with Ms. Anuja :

We started our new year with fun experiments based on a generally known scientific fact that water and oil don't mix together. We created an art and a sensory play based on the same phenomenon.

Friends experimented with different materials to see if they dissolve or mix well with water. We used milk, coffee powder, sand, flour, oil and of course water. We played a team activity where we had team water and a team with other mentioned ingredients. The teams tried to mix their ingredients with water to check if they are friends with team water or not.

We created a "Lithography" art on paper which is based on the idea of water and oil don't mix together.

We continued with the same topic for another session and created a lava lamp using water, food color, oil and Alka Seltzer. Friends created their own sensory bottles with food color, water, oil and tiny plastic snowflake sprinkles.

Science Experiments with Ms. Bhargavi:

Discovering Light and Color (January Recap)

This month, friends explored the concepts of light through fun and interactive experiments. They learned that light travels in a straight line by using a shoebox and flashlight. We talked about Sir Isaac Newton and his experiments with light. Using a prism, they saw how white light splits into a rainbow, revealing that light is made of many colors. The display of a rainbow captivated their curiosity, sparking excitement. We also explored how light interacts with different materials. Through a hands-on shoebox experiment, they classified objects as transparent, translucent, or opaque by observing how light passed through them. Materials like a clear plastic sheet, parchment paper, and toys helped illustrate these concepts. We ended the session with a demonstration of why the sky looks blue. Using a glass of water, a few drops of milk, and a flashlight, friends saw light scattering, just like it does in Earth's atmosphere. They learned that the blue part of light scatters more, giving the sky its beautiful color during the day.

Cookery Session :Rishtaya (A Syrian food) :

Date : 1/28/25

Rishtaya

Time : 1hr15mins

INGREDIENTS

- 1 pack brown lentil
- 1 pack pasta (any variety)
- 5-7 garlic cloves
- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 2 onions
- 1 lemon
- 1 bunch cilantro
- Salt
- Pepper
- pita bread

INSTRUCTIONS

- In a large saucepan over medium-high heat, combine the water and the lentils and bring to a boil. Reduce the heat until the liquid is at a simmer, and cook until the lentils are very tender, about 35 minutes.
- in a large skillet over medium heat, heat the oil until it shimmers. Add the onions and garlic and cook, stirring occasionally, until they are soft and just beginning to take on color, 10 to 15 minutes. Stir in half the chopped cilantro and cook, stirring, until completely wilted, about 1 minute. Remove from the heat.
- When the lentils are tender, add in the onion mixture. Add the pasta, salt and pepper, and stir to combine. Increase the heat to return to a boil, then reduce the heat so the liquid is simmering, and cook until the pasta is just tender, about 10 minutes. Stir in the lemon juice and the remaining chopped cilantro. Taste, and season with more salt, pepper and/or lemon juice as needed.
- Serve hot with pita bread and enjoy!
